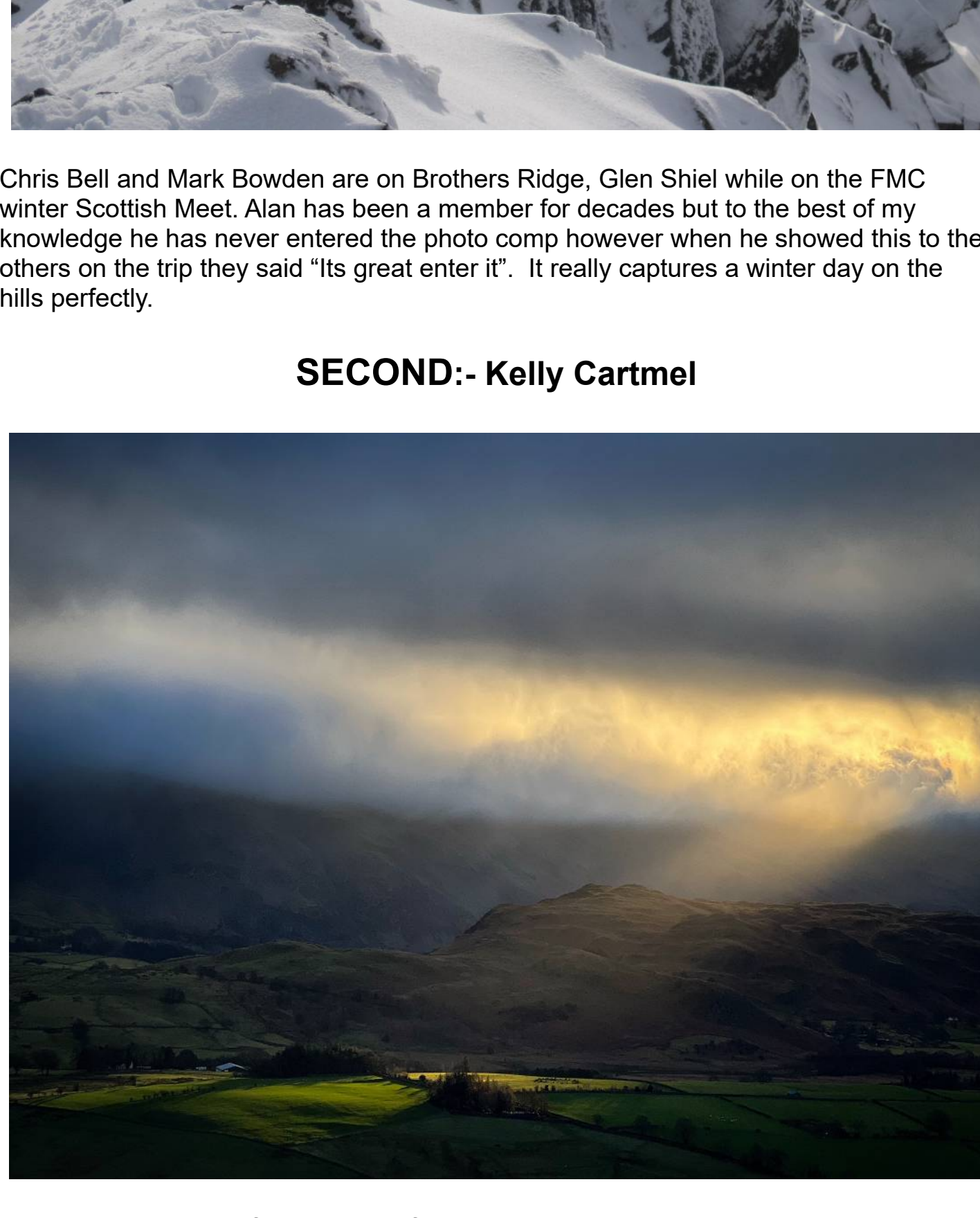




LANDSCAPE

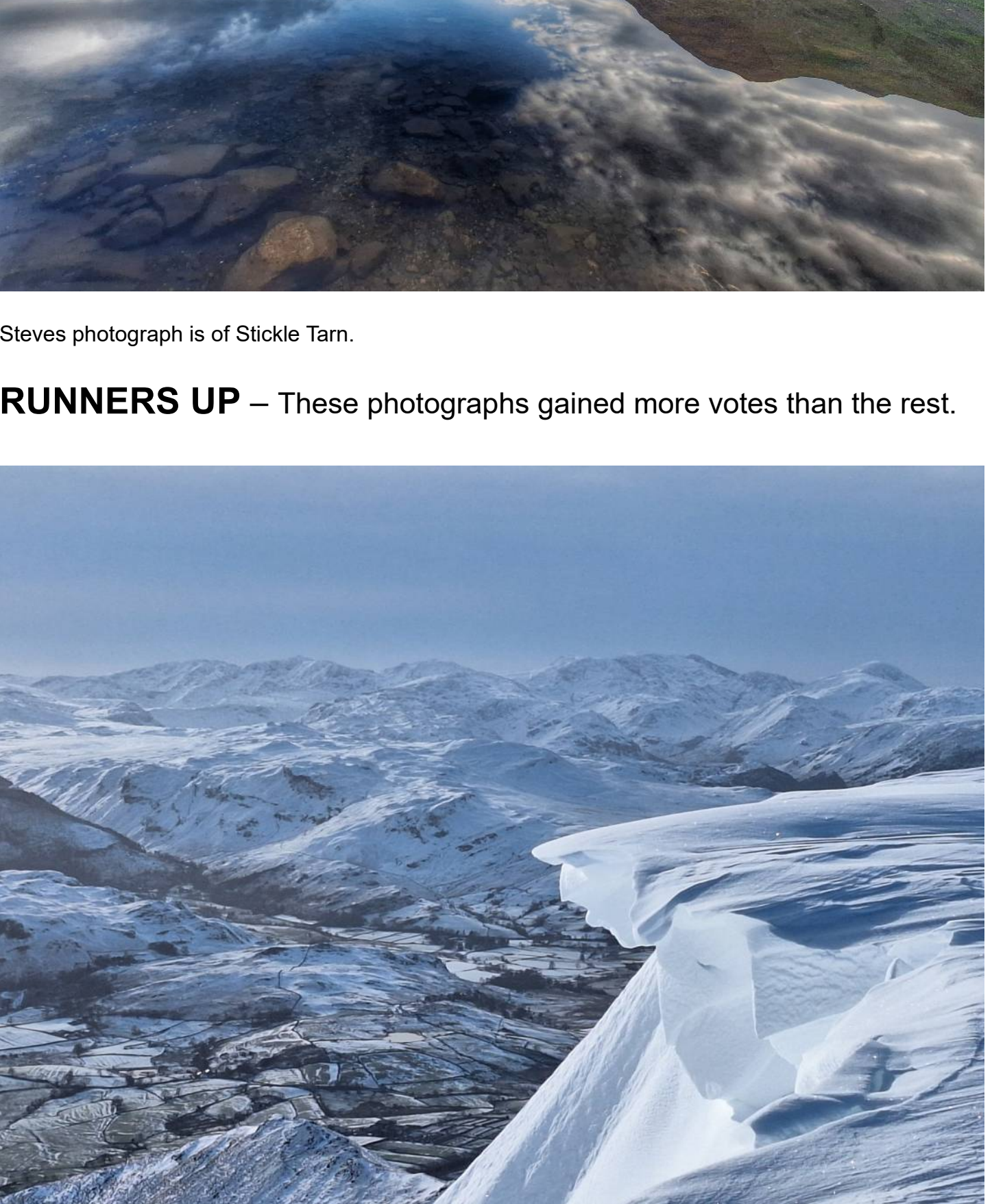

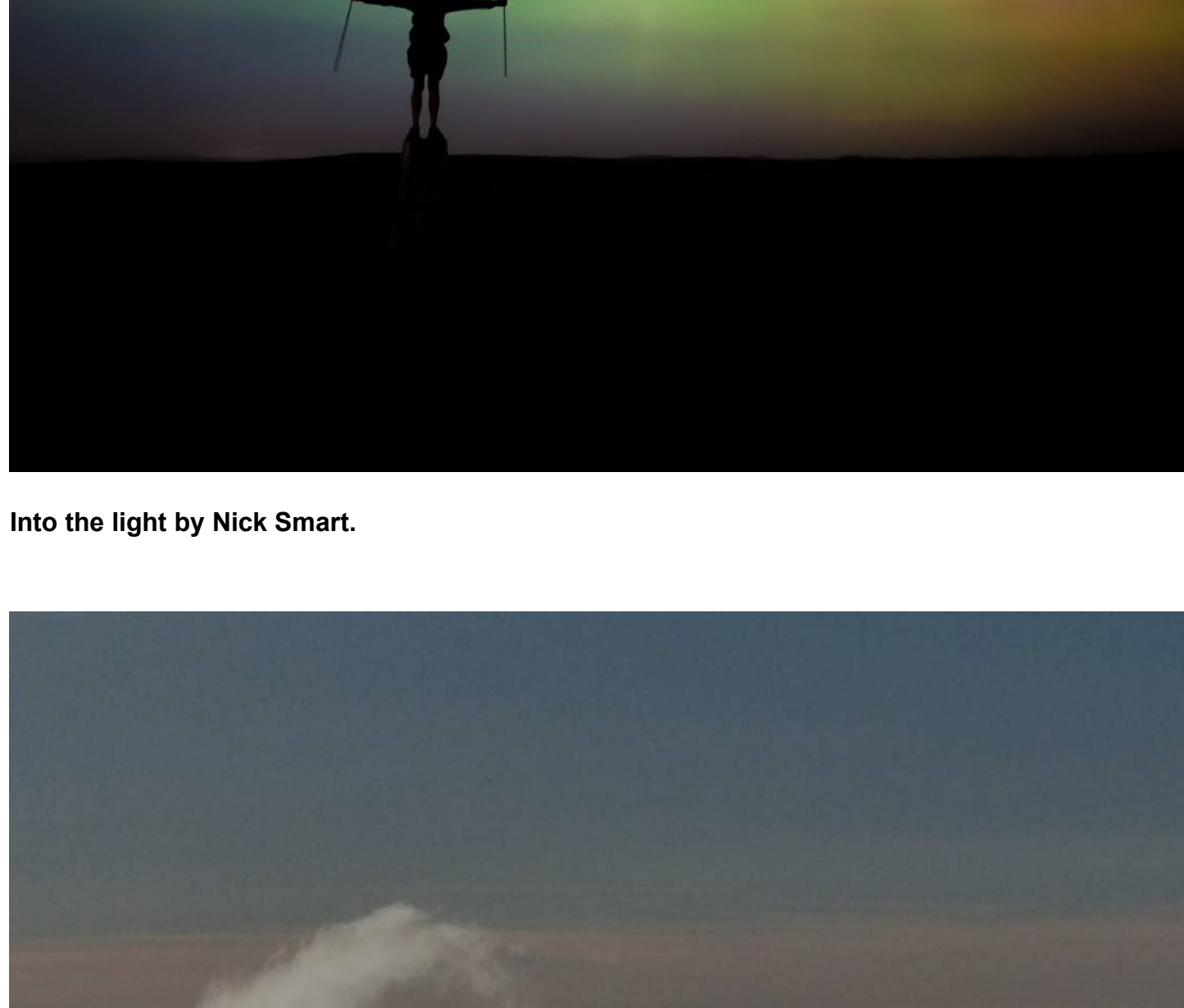

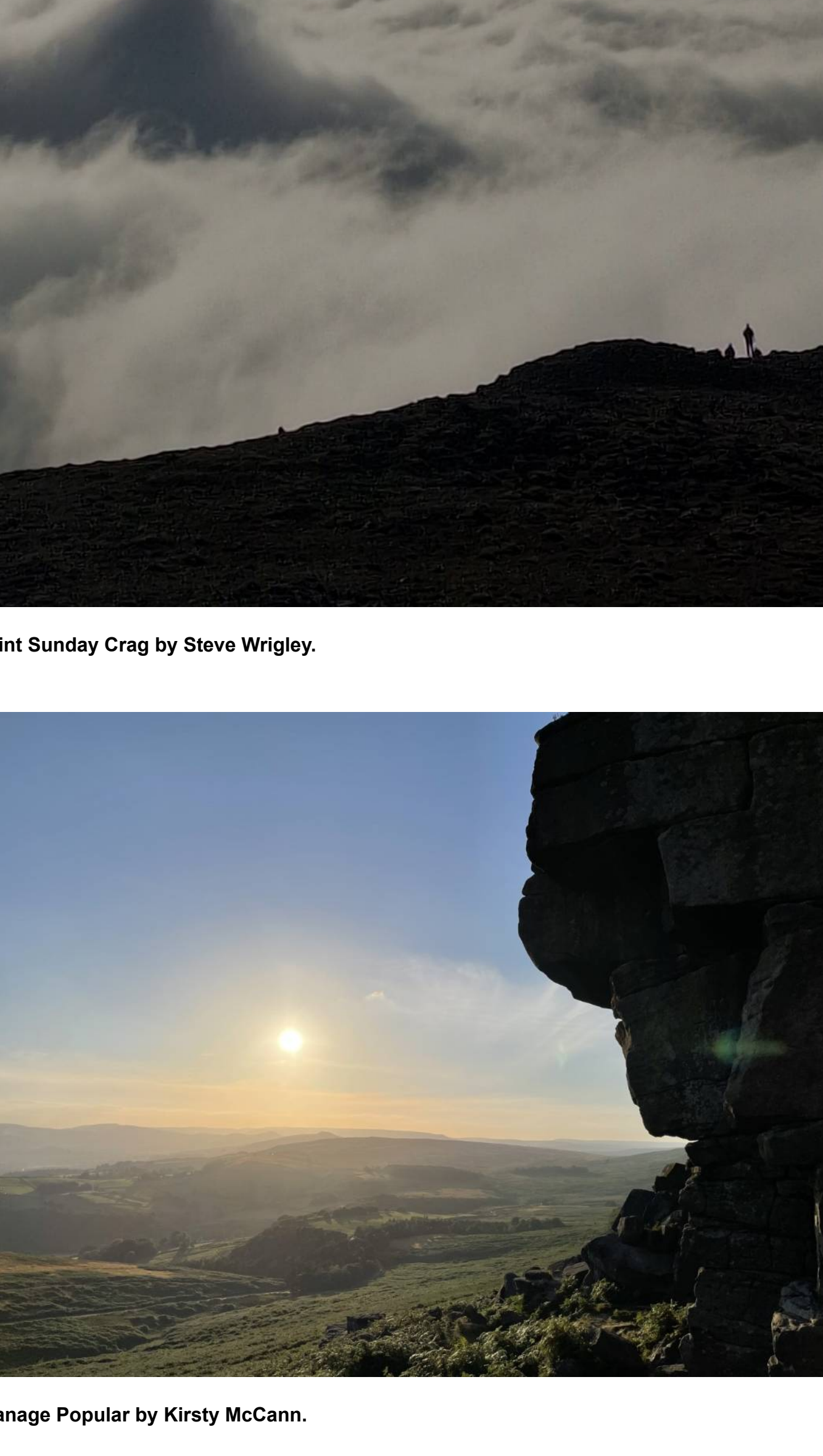

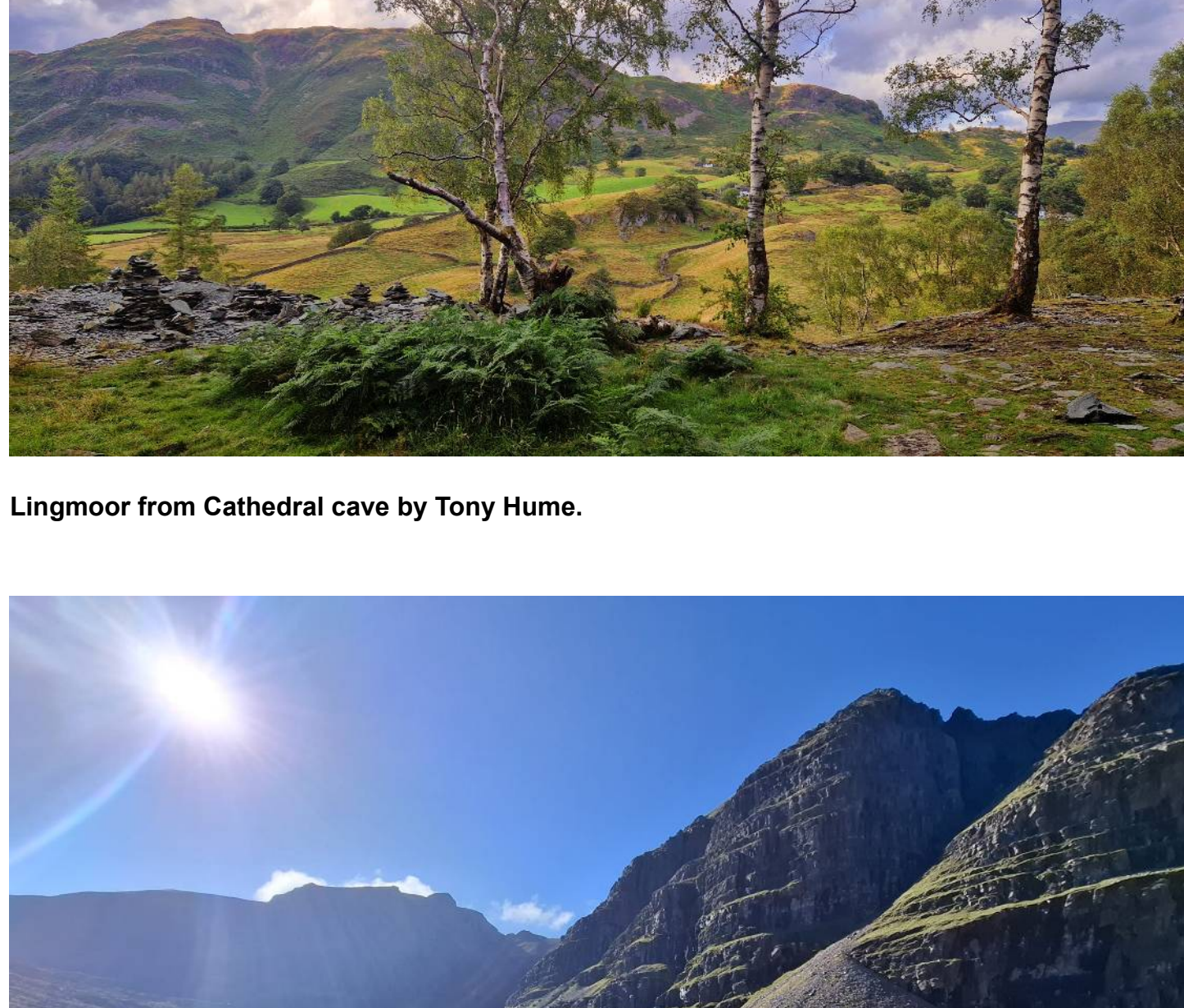

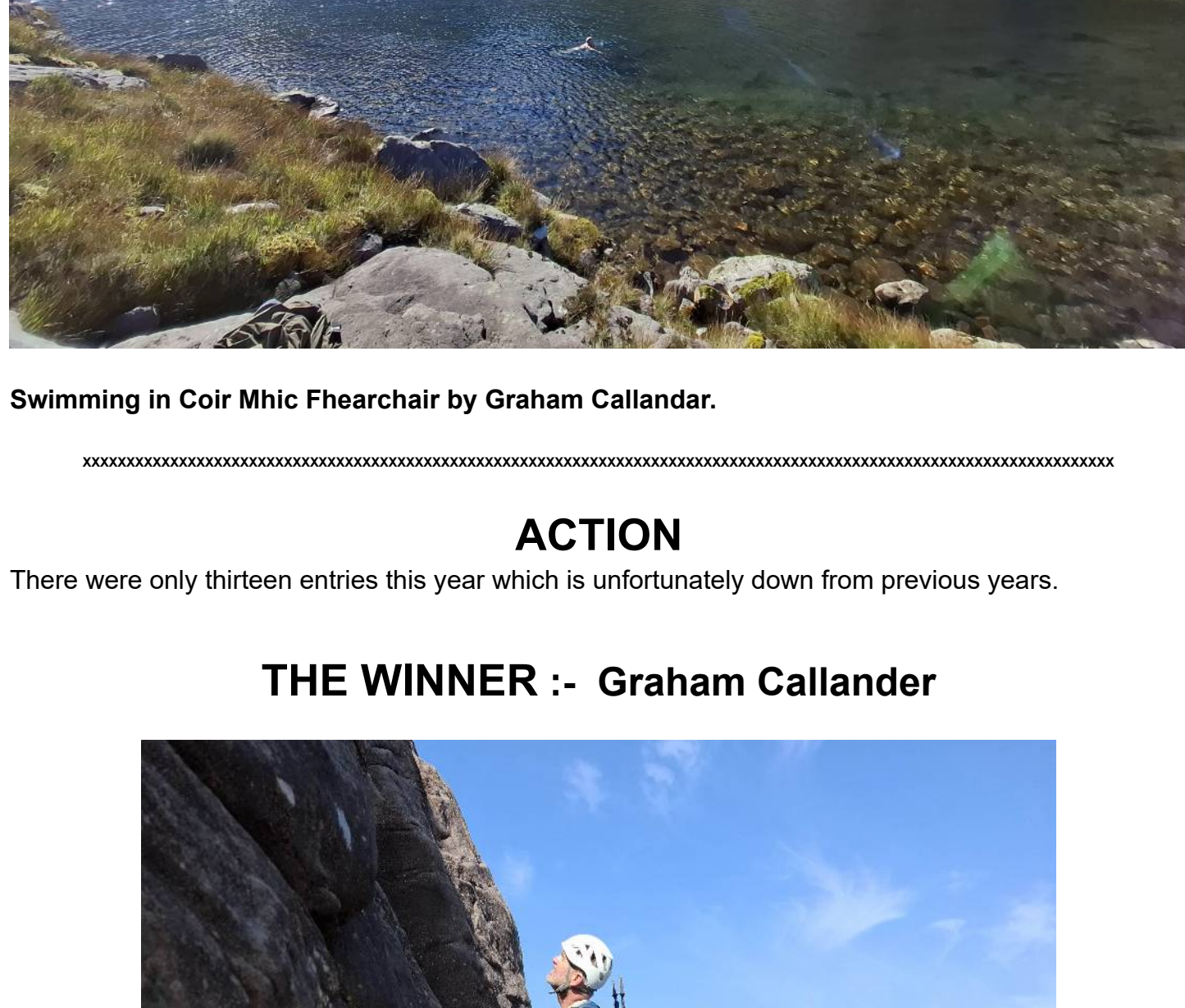

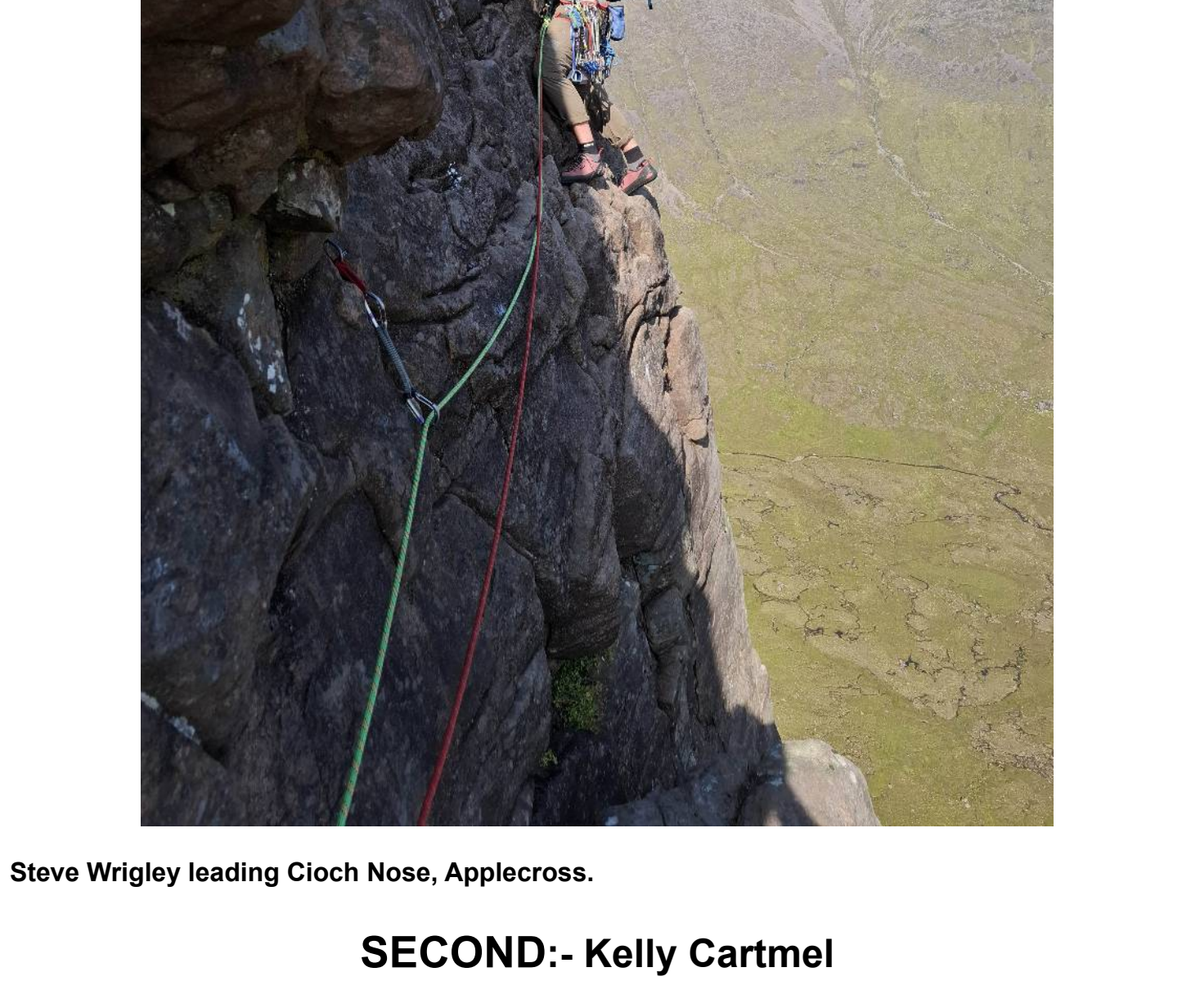

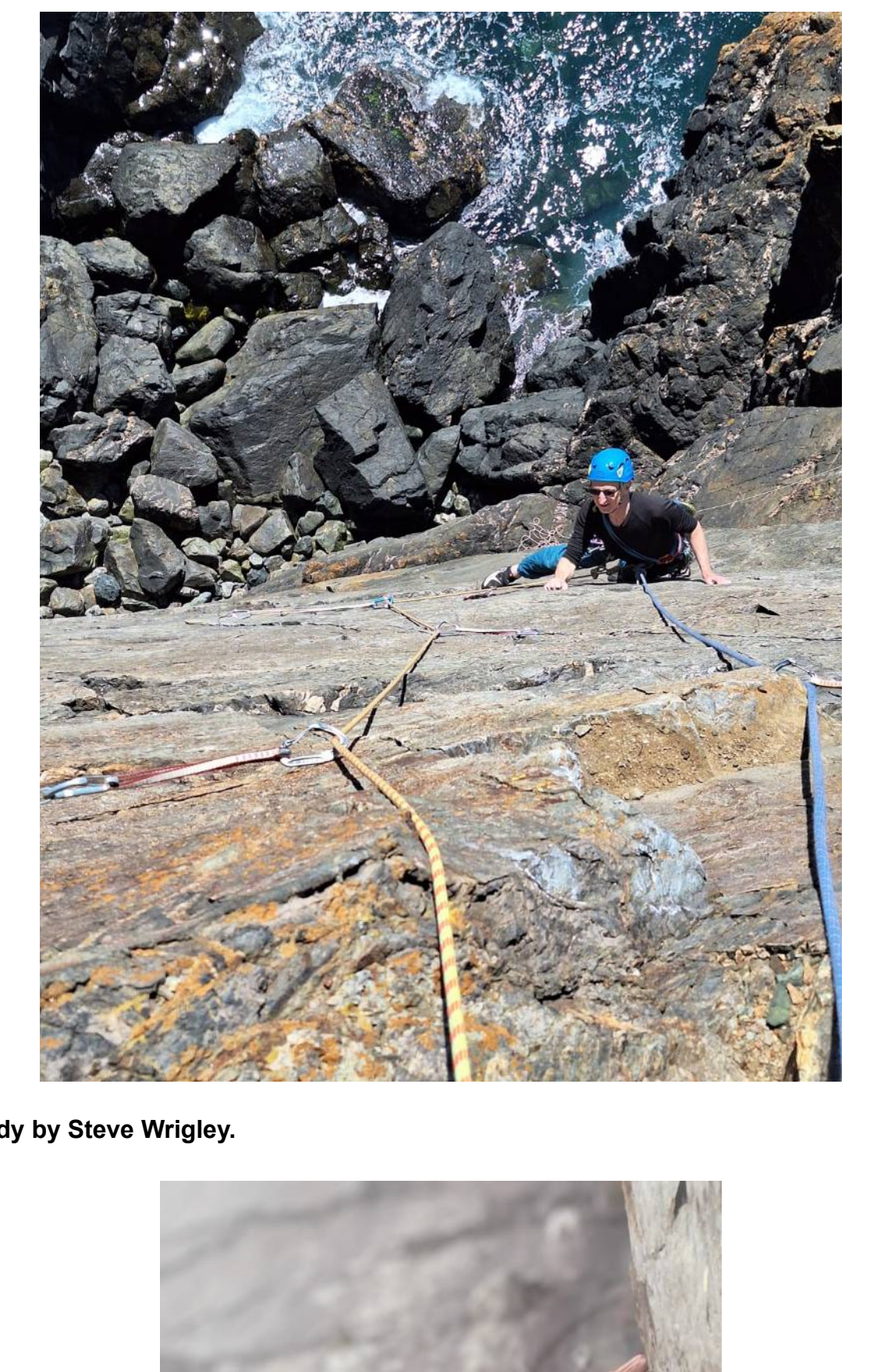

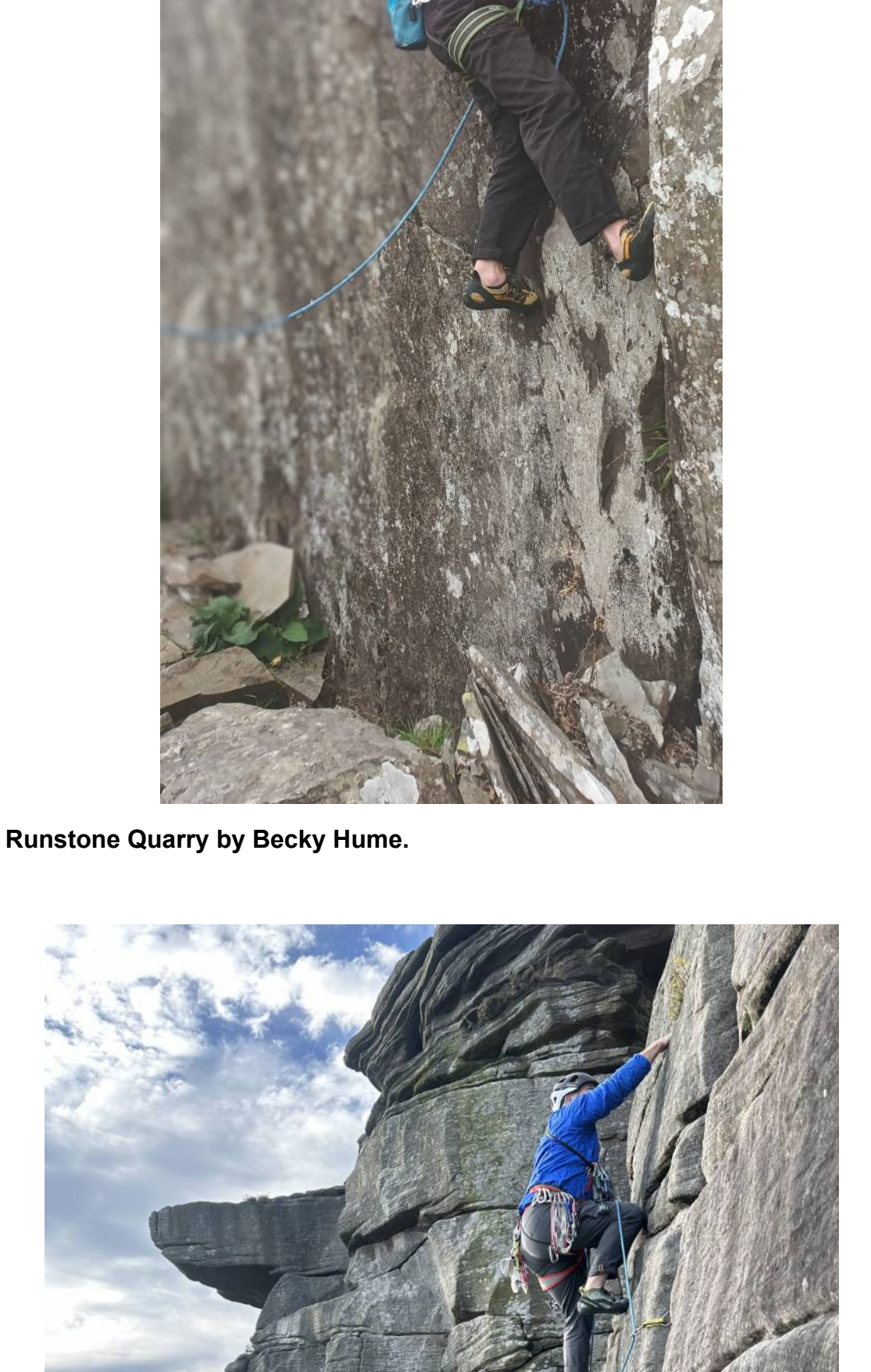
There were only thirteen entries this year which is unfortunately down from previous years.

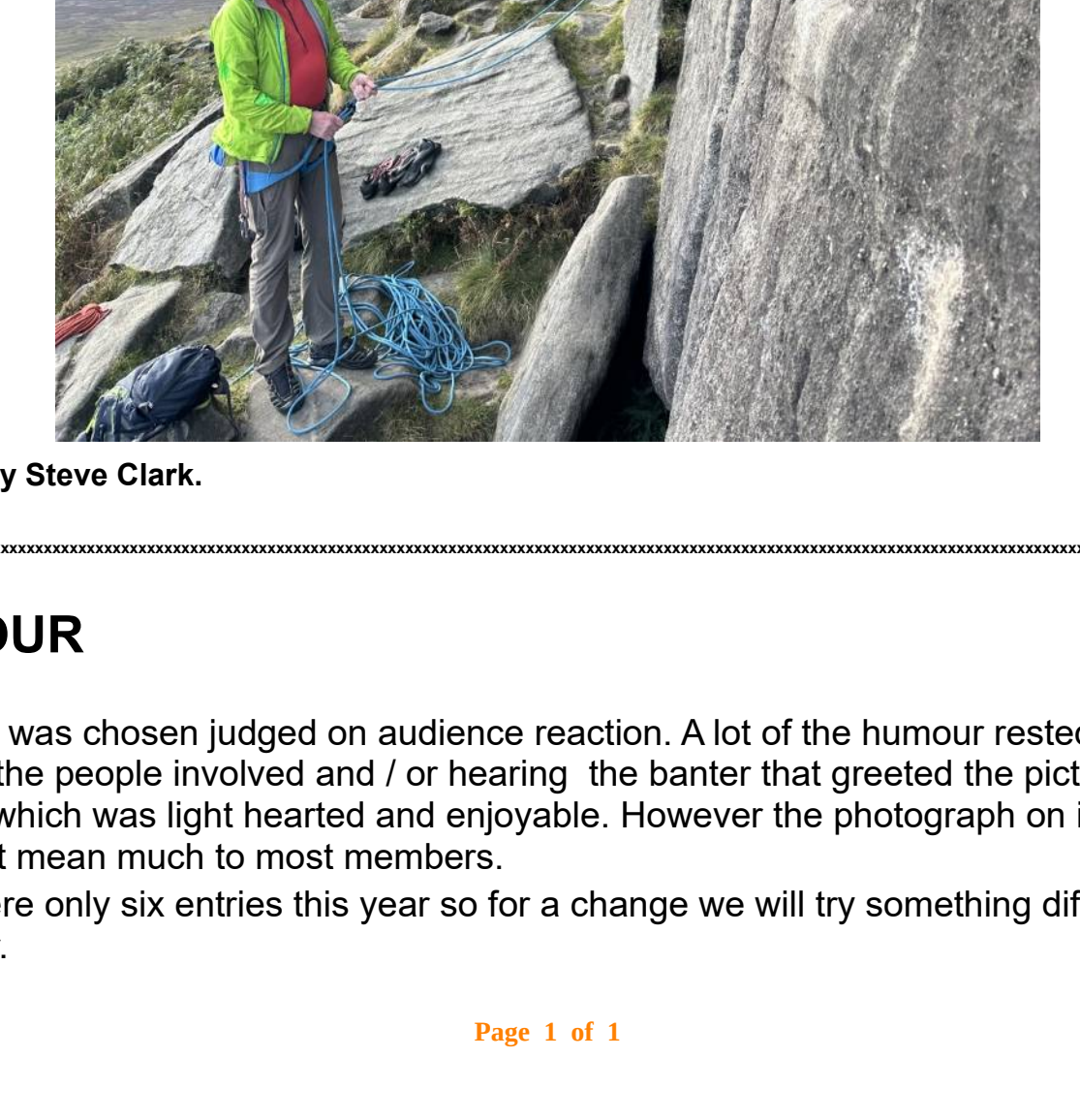
